

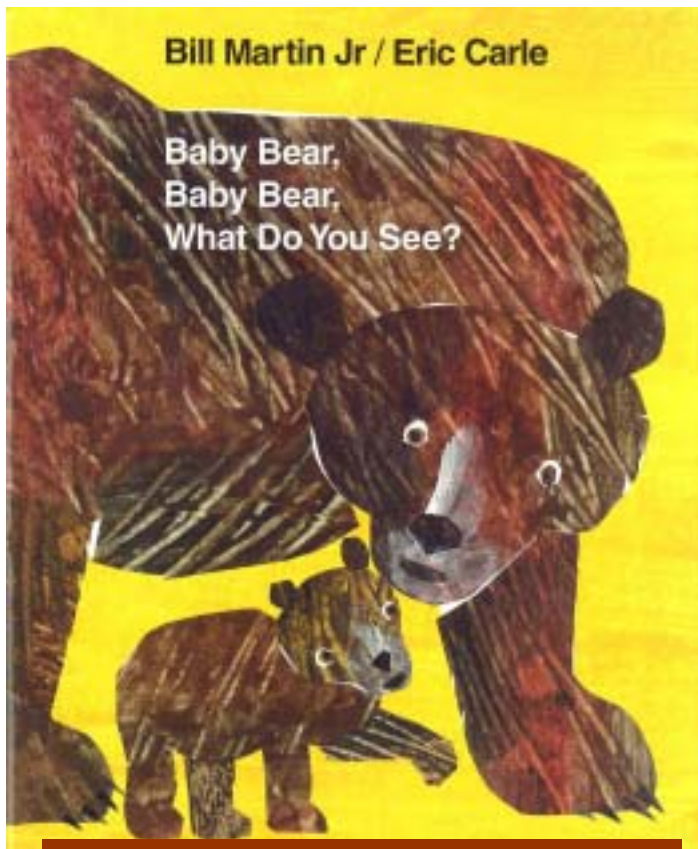

As an educator concerned with teaching young children about the joy of reading, he spends a great deal of time lecturing to teachers and working with children. He has also been extensively involved with creating audiovisual material for classroom use, and has recently begun developing computer software.

Eric Carle is one of America's leading children's book illustrators. Born in the United States, he spent some time in Germany where he studied at the Academy of Applied Art in Stuttgart. His work has won many awards and has been published in more than a dozen countries around the world.

Young readers will enjoy Baby Bear's quest to find Mama, and they'll revel in identifying each of the native North American animals that appear along the way. This gentle story is the final collaboration between Bill Martin Jr. and Eric Carle and a celebration of a familiar wildlife – and the special bond between mother and child – is a fitting finale to a beloved series.

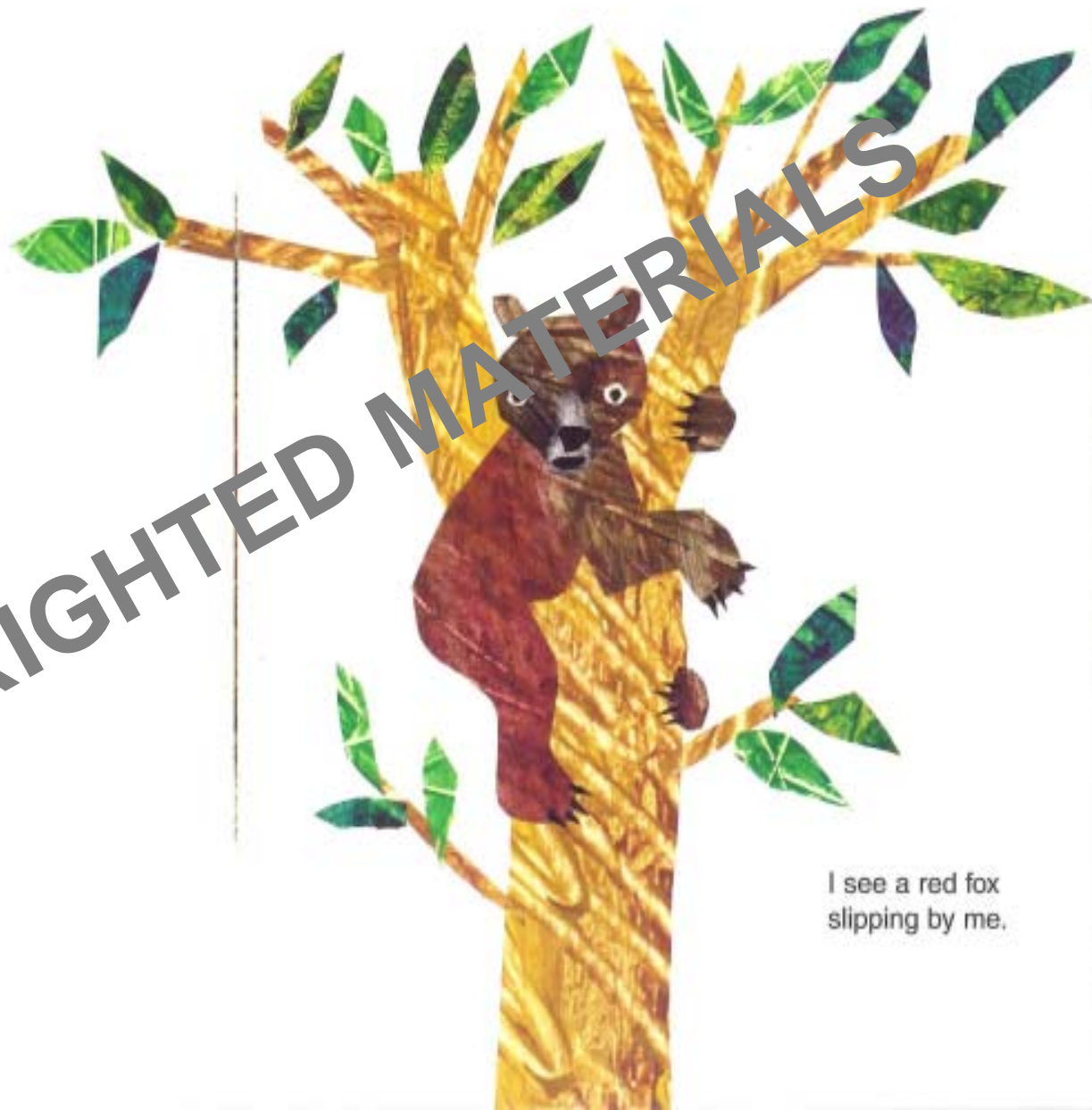

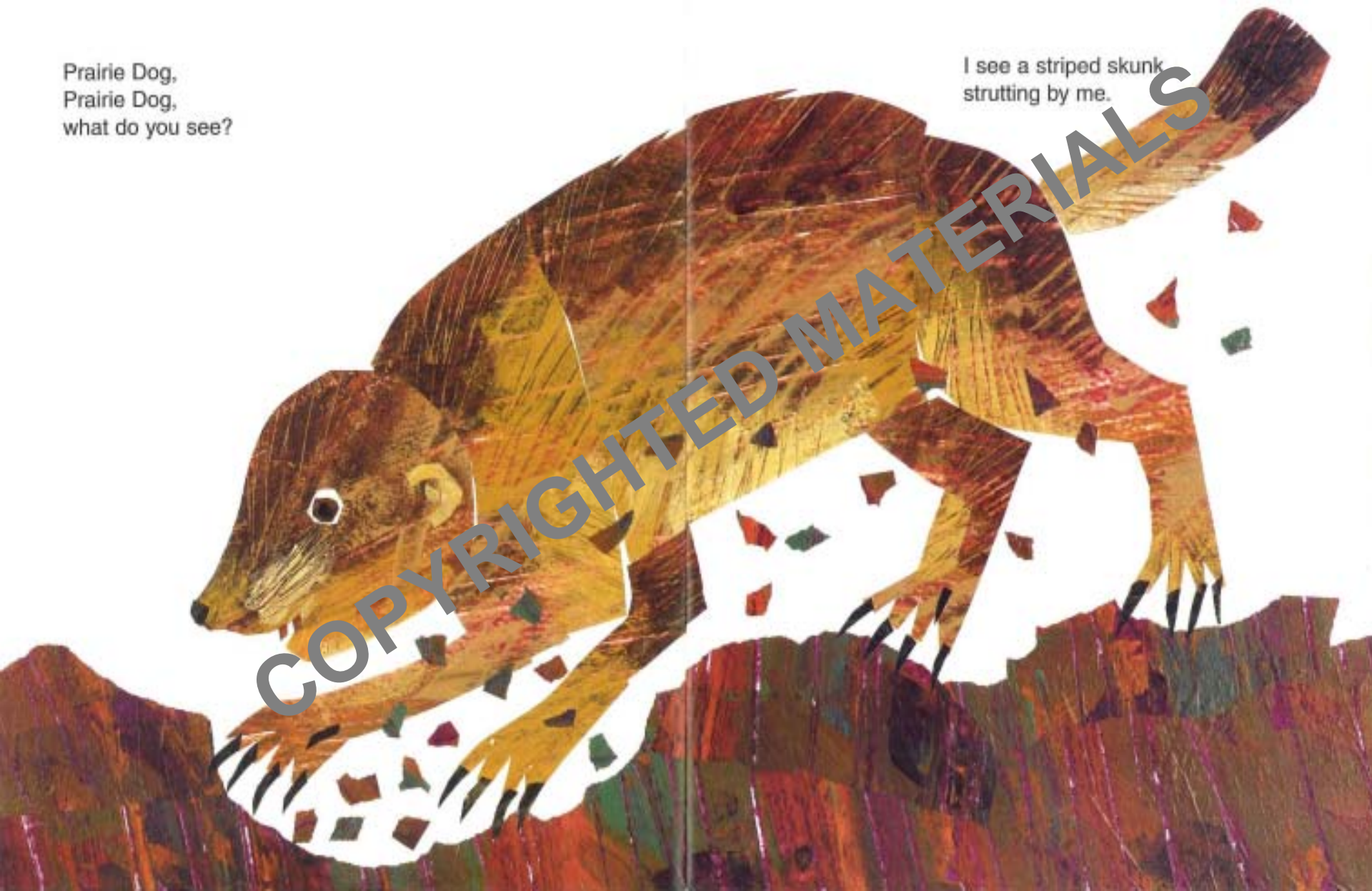

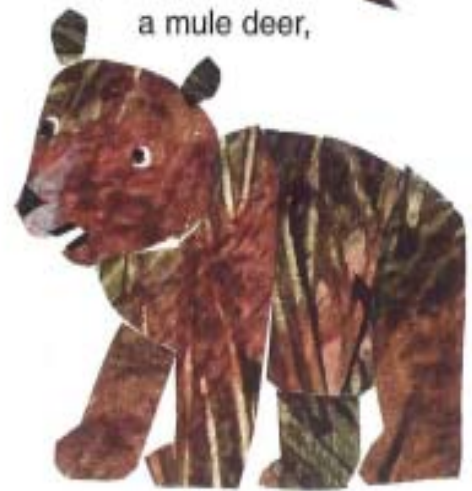
